

Students have been engaged in learning about The ANZACs, World War 1 and the significance of war memorials. As part of their studies students have:

- learnt about the important role memorials play in society
- enquired about the impact that the ANZAC legend has on Australia
- visited local war memorials to observe, measure and draw
- designed their own memorials, making links between their design and the feelings, attitudes and messages that they are wanting to portray
- published poetry relating to the impact of war
- produced artworks depicting life before, during and after war
- worked together in research teams and planning committees to learn more about the ANZACs, World War 1 and the design of Bridgewater's new memorial
- worked with an architect to bring their memorial plan ideas to life
- worked together to apply for a grant, which included holding open events for families and VIPs that will be assessing the grant application
- researched what conditions were like in WW1 and life back home in Australia
- shared their leaning with others including the school, local community, RSLs and council
- planned fundraising events
- corresponded with and made and sent Anzac biscuits to Sutton Veny School in England
- become caretakers of the local World War 2 memorial
- researches WW1 servicemen from Bridgewater
